On Monday 2nd February, we celebrated Mellow Yellow Day at St Matthew's. Children explored what mental health means and how it connects to our emotions and behaviours, while taking part in calming activities such as mindful minutes, yoga, singing and practising the "five big breaths" strategy to help with self-regulation. In Early Years, children made positive pencils to remind them of kind thoughts and positive feelings.



Safer Internet Day - Tuesday 10th February

For Internet Safety Day 2026, children across the school took part in a range of activities focused on the safe and responsible use of technology, with a special emphasis on artificial intelligence (AI). Pupils explored what AI is, how it can be used to support learning, and the importance of using it safely and thoughtfully. Through class discussions and practical activities, children learned about checking information carefully, protecting personal data, being respectful online and understanding that AI-generated content is not always accurate.

The day provided valuable opportunities for pupils to develop their digital literacy skills and to reflect on how they can be responsible and safe digital citizens both in school and at home.
