Learn new vocabulary. Use new vocabulary through the day. Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.  Explain how things work and why they might happen. Mastering Number  Continue to develop their subitising skills for numbers within and beyond 5, and increasingly connect quantities to numerals · begin to identify missing parts for numbers within 5 · explore the structure of the numbers 6 and 7 as '5 and a bit' and connect this to finger patterns and the Hungarian number frame · focus on equal and unequal groups when comparing numbers understand that two equal groups can be called a 'double' and connect this to finger patterns · sort odd and even numbers according to their 'shape' · continue to develop their understanding of the counting sequence and link cardinality and ordinality through the 'staircase' pattern · order numbers and play track games · join in with verbal counts beyond 20, hearing the repeated pattern within the counting numbers.
