

In my WRITING...



I can segment spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes spelling many correctly.

I can spell most Y2 common exception words.

I can write from memory simple sentences dictated by the teacher involving GPCs, tricky words and punctuation.

I can add suffixes to spell longer words (e.g. -ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly)

I can spell a range of words with contractions (e.g. 'can't', 'won't').

I can use singular possessive apostrophes

I can spell some homophones (e.g. there, their, they're) and distinguish between near homophones.

I can use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters.

I can write capital and lower case letters of the correct size and orientation, relative to each other.

I can understand which letters need to be joined in my writing and use the correct stroke.

I can form lower case letters of the correct size, relative to one another.

I can read aloud what I have written using my voice to make the meaning clear.

I can write using different genres, including narratives about personal experiences, real events and poetry.

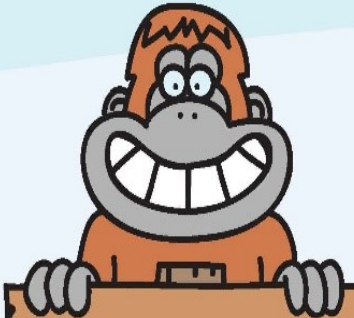
I can organise my writing for different purposes.

I can use interesting adjectives to describe nouns (expanded noun phrases).
