What have we been up to:

On Thursday, 2nd October pupils at Dartmouth Academy were very fortunate to have a visit from Conrad Humphreys. Our primary pupils are reading a book all about a sailing adventure and so were inspired to see Conrad's boat Bounty. The children couldn't believe that he and his fellow sailing comrades undertook an unbelievable adventure across the South Pacific, following the footsteps of Captain Bligh in 1789. Our secondary pupils had an assembly from our visitor and were fascinated to listen about why people should step out of their comfort zones and go on incredible adventures, even when others are questioning why they would! Brilliant questions were asked and we are so grateful for Conrad for taking the time to come and speak to us.











We're absolutely delighted to share the news that Class 1-2 at Dartmouth Academy have been partnered with a class of children in a school in Ukraine to share the joy of reading and create connections between communities in the UK and Ukraine.

The schools have been matched through the British Council's UK-Ukraine School Partnerships programme, which is funded by the Department for Education. This unique new initiative supports schools to build lasting international partnerships, and explore reading as a tool to expand horizons, build confidence and boost mental wellbeing. The programme connects 100 schools in the UK and Ukraine (50 schools in the UK with 50 in Ukraine). Class 1-2 will work on activities with a similarly aged class of children, our aim is to encourage reading for pleasure, whilst building an understanding of each other's cultures through a common love for reading.

I went to Krakow, Poland, to meet our partner teacher, Oksana, and plan the first stages of our working partnership. Oksana was an inspiration, she loved our approach to reading, the strategies we use to inspire a love of reading here at Dartmouth Academy, and shared some of their practice.

Class 1-2 will meet their partner class online just after half term. Watch this space!



Parent/Carer Information Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content. The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

What this means for you:

- If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.
- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

We will continue to share updates from the publisher as more information becomes available.











Going to school every day is important for **children's learning, confidence and future success.**Parents play a key role in setting the expectation that school attendance is vital, while also listening and supporting their child if things feel difficult.

General Principles

- Assume attendance: Talk as if going to school is the normal, expected thing.
- Show empathy: Acknowledge feelings without reinforcing avoidance.
- Offer problem-solving: Ask gentle questions to understand barriers.
- Reinforce positives: Remind them of friends, activities, and progress.

a For Primary-Age Children

Supportive Phrases:

- "It's a school day today, let's get ready together."
- "Once you're there, I know you'll have fun with your friends."
- "You're brave, and I'm proud of you for going even when it feels tricky."
- "What part of today are you looking forward to? Story time? Playtime? Lunch with your friends?"
- "If something feels hard today, you can tell your teacher, and I'll listen after school too."
- "I know you don't feel like going, but school is important and I'll help you get through the tough bits."

If they say they don't want to go:

- "I hear that you're worried. Can you tell me one thing that feels hard right now?"
- "Let's think about what will help you when you get to school—would you like to see your teacher first or meet a friend?"

Closing Daily Encouragements

- "I'm proud of you for going in today."
- "Look at what you managed, even when it felt tough."
- "Every day at school is a step forward."
- "I can see your effort, and that matters."
