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### *This Week in school*

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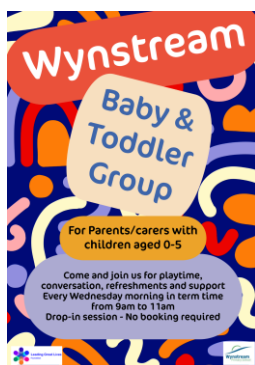
Dear Parents and Carers,

We're inviting Year 6 parents/carers to join us for lunch Week commencing 8th December. Lunch will begin around 12:50 pm (some classes may be slightly later).

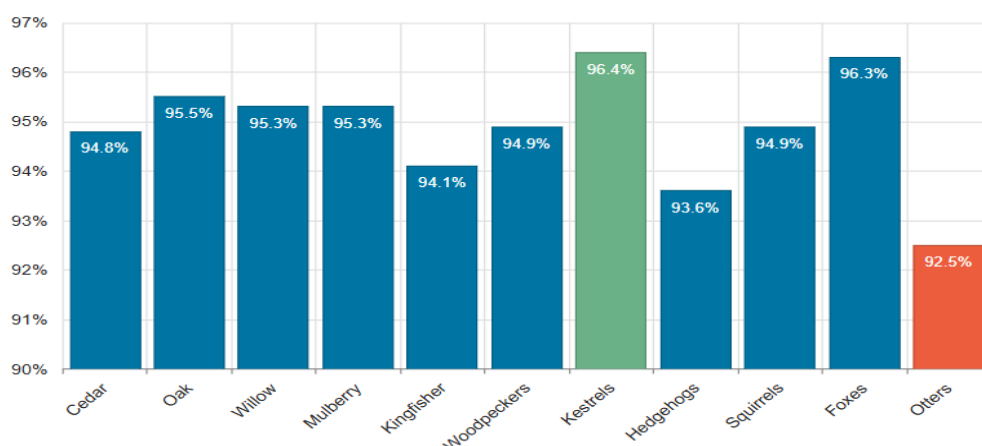
- Cost: £3.50 per meal (payable via the school office or ParentPay)

## Online Safety

Further to an incident outside of school at the weekend involving some children from Wynstream, we would like to remind parents some advice about staying safe online:

### ☒ Follow Age Restrictions

Most social media and messaging apps have age limits:

- **WhatsApp** – Minimum age **13** in the UK (previously **16**)
- **Snapchat, TikTok, Instagram** – Minimum age **13**

These rules exist to protect children from harmful content and strangers.

### ☐ Practical Tips for Parents

- **Check App Permissions**  
Disable location sharing and features that allow strangers to connect.
- **Set Up Parental Controls**  
Use tools like Google Family Link or built-in device settings to manage screen time and app downloads.
- **Regular Check-Ins**  
Ask open questions:  
*"Who do you chat with online?"*  
*"Has anyone sent you something that made you uncomfortable?"*
- **Model Good Habits**  
Show children how you use technology responsibly.

## Teach Children These Rules

- **Think Before You Click**  
If something feels wrong, **stop and tell an adult.**
- **Never Share Passwords**  
Except with parents.
- **Be Kind Online**  
Treat others as you would in person.

## Signs to Watch For

- Sudden secrecy about devices
- Emotional changes after using apps
- Unexplained new contacts or usernames


## Talk PANTS with Your Child

The NSPCC's **PANTS rule** helps children understand that their body belongs to them and they should speak up if something feels wrong:

- **P** – Privates are private
- **A** – Always remember your body belongs to you
- **N** – No means no
- **T** – Talk about secrets that upset you
- **S** – Speak up, someone can help
