- Show knowledge and some understanding of the religious signs and the steps involved in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Show some understanding about a range of beliefs about Mary.
- Show some understanding of reconciliation by making links between reconciliation and the life of Jesus e.g, stories of reconciliation in the Gospels, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, (Stations of the Cross)
- Describe The Parable of The Lost Son accurately and in detail and show some understanding of what it tells us about reconciliation.
