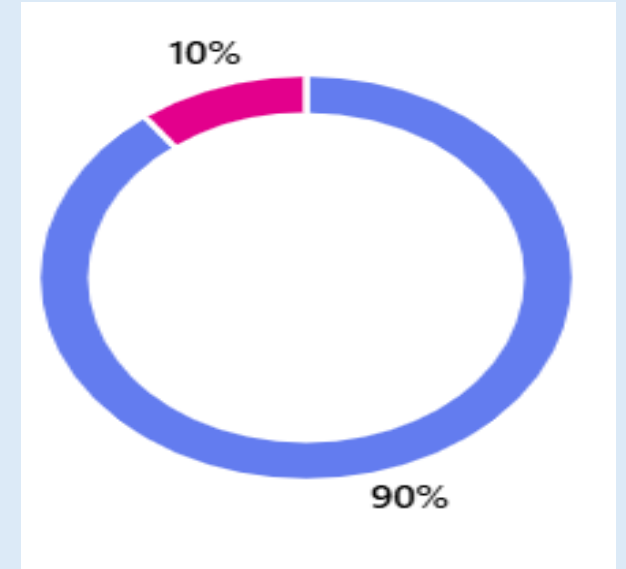

- *Relationship & sex education should not be for primary age pupils as I think is not appropriate they should know because of their Age they are small and developing.*

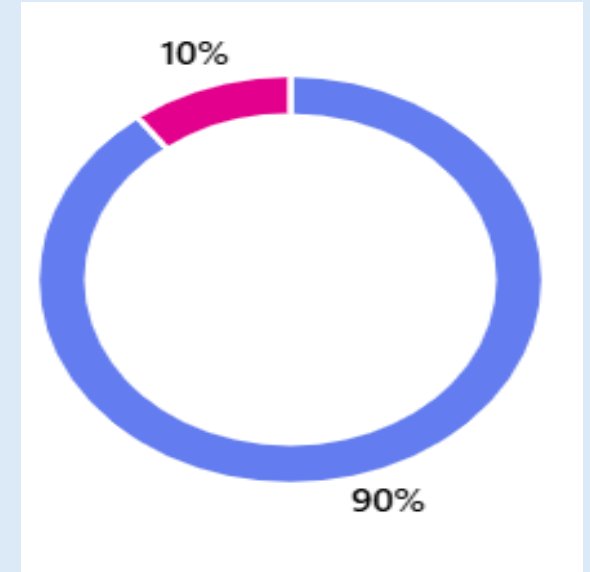
# School response

- *Sex education taught in primary level will lead a child to addiction to watch Pornography content.*

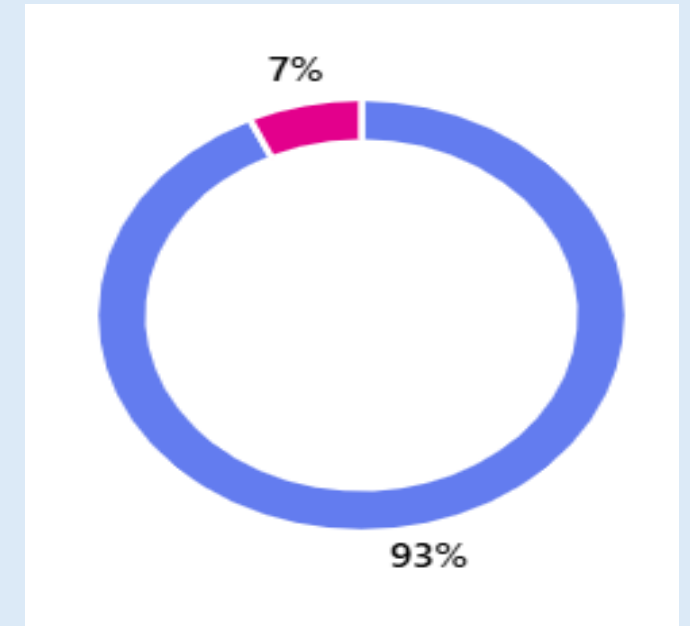
# School response

- *No it's not appropriate for this as it will effect a child mentally & emotionally.*



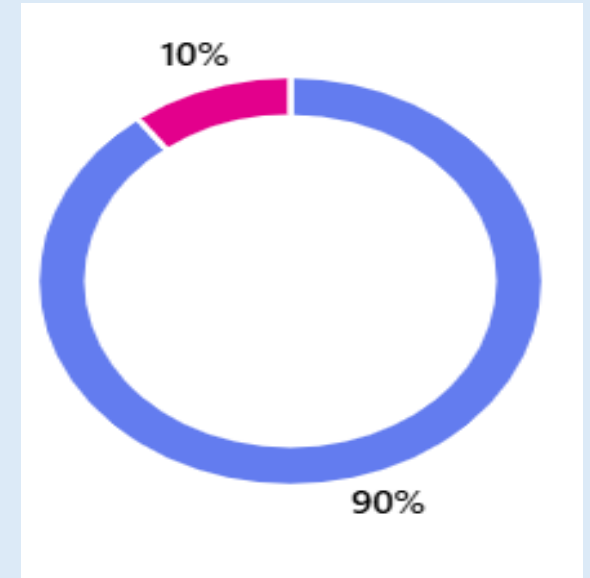
# School response

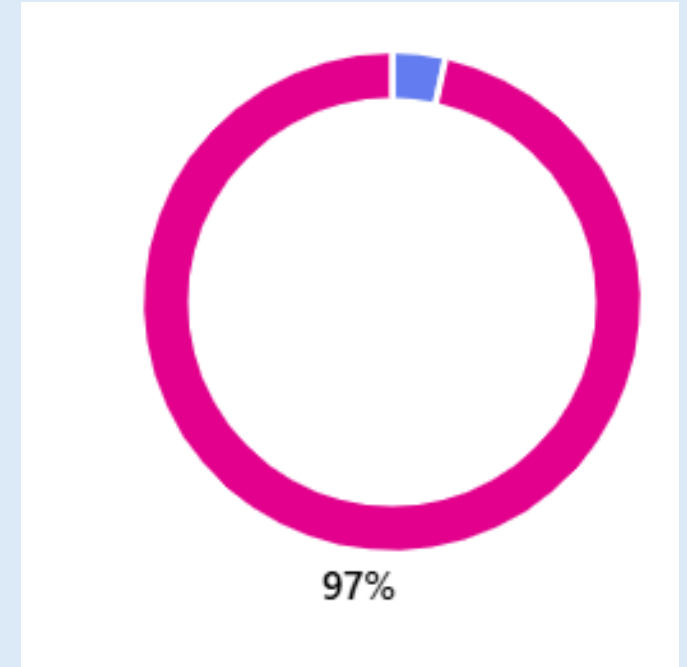
# School response
