

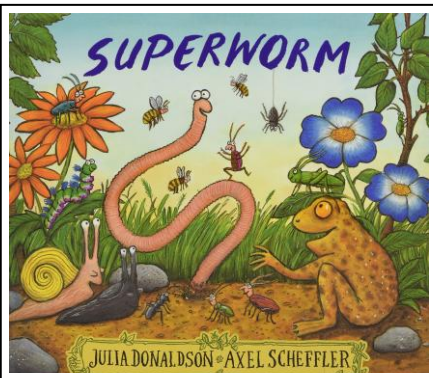
## This week in Reception

### Phonics:

In Phonics this week we will be revisiting all the phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs - ai, oa ee, igh, ur, or, er, ar, ow, oi, ear, air. We will be reading words containing 2 or more digraphs - sharp, harsh, shark, march, sheep, cheep, queen, chain chart, tooth, singer, thinker, powder, corner, farmer, shorter, shower, power.

We will be reading and writing sentences such as : The singer has a helmet with a torch.

Tricky words - his, her, of, as, we, me, be, she, he, they, was, you, all, pure, sure, my, by, are.



## Week beginning 2.3.26

### What we are learning:

We are continuing our learning on Protective Behaviours and our focus is 'we all have the right to feel safe all of the time.' We will be beginning to explore what our own early warning signs are when we don't feel safe.

In Literacy, we will be sharing the story of 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson and exploring new vocabulary such as 'lasso, mope, squirm, toil, cunning, chant, lair.' We be talking about Superworm's qualities and writing adjectives to describe him.

In maths, we will be working on solving problems of addition by counting on and we will be exploring the composition of 10 by counting on as we reveal the amounts hidden under 3 pots. We will be counting in twos and consolidating doubles.

### At home

Please continue to reinforce cursive letter formation by either using the Letter-join app or by using paints, chalks, or pencils. Writing cards and shopping lists are a fun way to consolidate good letter formation. All lower case letters start on the line.

As we are learning about real- life superheroes such as doctors, nurses, police officers and many, many more. If any parent or relative would like to talk to the children about their amazing role, we would love to hear from you.
