Harper - that teddy is 47 years old and has been on every adventure!



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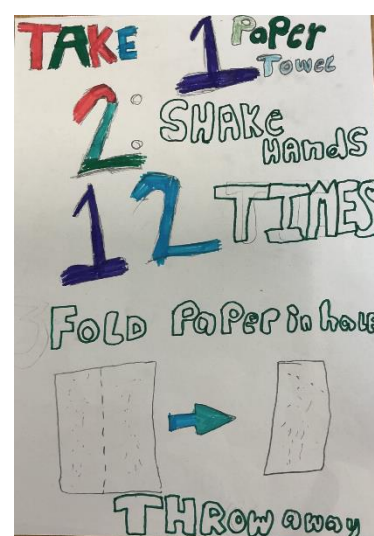
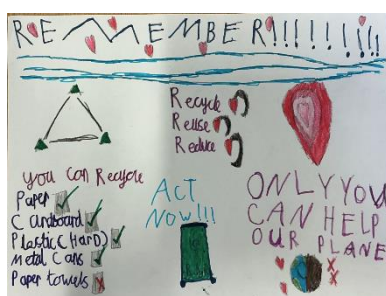
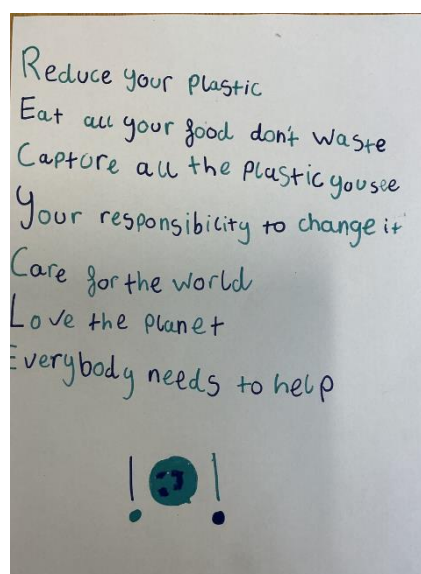

### Reduce, Reuse and Recycle with the Primary Phase

Last week, a group of enthusiastic KS2 pupils took part in an exciting Waste Action Day aimed at improving recycling across the school. Working alongside Alex and Izzy from Resources Futures, the children reviewed the results of a recent recycling audit and discussed what had been found and what actions were needed. They then got busy creating eye-catching bin labels and posters using scrap and best paper, helping to clearly show where recycling should go and which materials belong in each bin. The pupils also worked together to write an assembly script, learned a fun recycling song, and played a game to deepen their understanding of why reducing, reusing and recycling matters.

In the afternoon, pupils practised what they had prepared before confidently presenting an assembly to the whole primary school. They shared what they had learned, explained how everyone can recycle better, and highlighted where recycling bins are located and how to use them correctly. The day not only helped improve recycling systems within the school but also empowered pupils to become eco-champions, spreading an important message to others and encouraging the whole school community to take better care of the environment. A special shout-out goes to Mia-Rose M who is our Year 6 Environment Leader and will be leading a team of pupils to ensure the action ideas are followed up in school.
