What are the expectations for planning? Is there a set format?

Jigsaw is a comprehensive and whole school approach. Each year group has six puzzles (2 puzzles per term) and each puzzle has 6 weeks' worth of lessons. Lesson plans and resources are provided for each lesson.

What are the expectations for assessment? When are assessments due?

This is called the Jigsaw Journey. Every child completes one immediately after the lesson. This is the same format for all the year groups. The children will be asked how they feel both towards the actual taught unit of work (purple) and the social and emotional skills (green).

PSHE lessons are delivered for a minimum of 30 minutes per week throughout the school. Further PSHE and Relationships Education objectives are also covered through whole school events (e.g. Anti-bullying week and Children in need). Assemblies and across many other curriculum areas (as outlined in the Learning Ladders). The first Friday of each half term are PSHE days to teachers to cover Jigsaw or anything which is relevant to the children.
