

#### **Nut Free**

A reminder that we are a 'Nut Free' school which includes Nutella, Snickers and other products containing nuts.



#### **Mobile Phone Policy**

Please remember that mobile phones are not to be used inside school by parents or visitors.

#### **School Meals Price Increase**

We have received notification from the School Meals team that there will be a price increase from 1<sup>st</sup> October and have been asked to share this message with you:

Dear Parent/carer

Please be advised that the cost of a school meal is set to increase from £2.80 to £3.05 per meal from  $1^{st}$  of October 2025. This will result in an overall weekly increase of £1.25 per child.

This does not affect children accessing Free School Meals. The government continues to support the universal infant Free School Meals (FSM) project and this means that all children from reception, year 1 and year 2 will be provided with a school meal free of charge. Any child in years 3-6 can also have a free school meal if you are in receipt of certain allowances. The council has been subsidising the service over the last few years to try and keep the cost of a meal down. However, increases in food and staffing costs mean that we unfortunately have no option but to increase the price of a school meal.

The three weekly rolling menu detailing each day's main course and dessert, with the additional daily offer of a vegetarian option and jacket potato will remain in place. The school meals service will continue to provide a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements, and is served in a safe environment on our school premises. We will continue to offer theme days, treat lunches and inviting families to join children for special lunches through the year.

\*If your child is eligible for means tested free schools meals you could also be eligible for other funded support, such as <u>Household Support Fund</u> (funding for food and utility bills) and <u>Holiday Activities and Food</u> (summer holiday free activities and food). #### **Extra-Curricular Clubs**

Our extra-curricular clubs for the Autumn Term are available to book via our new app. Our booking system went live on Monday, 1<sup>st</sup> September and will remain open until midnight on Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> September. Clubs will <u>start</u> the week commencing Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> September.

During the Autumn Term we do not offer clubs to our Class F children; we allow time for them to settle into the school routine and for our staff to get to know them before inviting them to join clubs.

Please note that we expect children who attend clubs to maintain our high standards of behaviour and respect at all times. #### **Fiddle Toys**

We understand that some children find it easier to concentrate when using a fiddle toy, and we recognise the positive role these can play in supporting focus and learning. To ensure they are used appropriately and do not distract others, children may only use a fiddle toy in school with the agreement of both their parent and class teacher. Our preferred options are silent versions, less likely to disrupt classmates. Please do not send your child to school with a fiddle or chew toy without speaking to the class teacher.

#### **Late Collection**

We kindly ask all parents and carers to make every effort to collect children on time from school activities. Please note that repeated late collection will incur additional fees, as staff must be paid for the extra time required. Details can be found in the attached *Schedule of Fees*.

#### **Uniform**

**Our new uniform provider**: Warrington Schoolwear stocks our updated smarter and more durable PE uniform, which includes a dark green, zipped jacket that is designed not to fade in the wash or snag with use.

As your child outgrows their PE uniform, please purchase the new version. Over the next 6 months there will be a transition period where we allow families to move from the old cotton hoody to the new technical fabric, zipped jacket and smarter t-shirt. Black tracksuit bottoms, shorts, leggings or skort remain the same. Our new provider can offer smart black tracksuit bottoms with a zipped pocket.

As part of our review of uniform requirements, we offer the <u>option</u> of wearing plain black trainers with their everyday school uniform—not just for PE. Please note that trainers must be plain and black, not white or brightly coloured. Velcro fastenings for children who cannot independently tie their laces please.

The thinking behind this, is closely linked to our commitment to keeping children active throughout the school day. We aim for all pupils to engage in at least 30 minutes of physical activity each day, in addition to PE lessons. We believe that allowing appropriate footwear throughout the day will help support this goal, ensuring children can participate fully and safely in all activities.

It is up to parents to decide whether to just purchase plain black trainers or to also have school shoes for when the children are wearing everyday school uniform. Children are welcome to keep a spare pair of trainers in school if they prefer to wear school shoes.

We have a selection of brand-new jade green uniform that was surplus stock from the previous provider. We have most, but not all sizes available. Each item is priced at £7. We also continue to have a collection of clean, good quality, pre-loved school uniform. These items are priced at £1 per item. Please speak to the school office if you need any new uniform.
