We have all noticed a shift in the weather this week and it is certainly feeling autumnal with a notable chill in the air. Please can you make sure that your child is wearing their winter uniform and brings a suitable coat into school. Thank you.

Prayer and Reflection

This week, on 27th September, is the feast day of St. Vincent de Paul (24th April 1581 – 27th September 1660). He was a French Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He was renowned for his compassion, humility and generosity. To help with his work with the poor, Vincent gathered a group of wealthy men and women dedicated to God. The women, who became the Sisters of Charity, nursed the sick and cooked meals for them. The men called themselves Priests of the Mission and collected food and clothes for those who could not work. After Vincent's death in 1660, the Vincentians and the Sisters of Charity continued the work Vincent had started. St. Vincent de Paul is the Patron Saint of all works of charity and a number of organisations have been inspired by his work and teaching, including the St. Vincent de Paul Society which was established in 1833 by French university students. The society is now present in 153 countries.
