Class 2/3 explored wheels and axels as part of their Mechanisms topic in Design Technology. They used buttons and cocktail sticks to make wheels and axels and attached these to pegs to make racing cars. It was fiddly but they rose to the challenge and thoroughly enjoyed the lesson!


