The Stations of the Cross

5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry the Cross
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
7. Jesus falls for the second time
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
9. Jesus falls for the third time
10. Jesus is stripped of his garments
11. Jesus is nailed to the Cross
12. Jesus dies on the Cross
13. Jesus is taken down from the Cross

**Example: Station 7 –
Jesus Falls the Second Time**

I chose this Station because it made me think about how we all struggle sometimes, and the best thing we can do is be kind. In my drawing, I imagined a boy falling off his bike on the sidewalk. Just as Jesus fell while carrying the cross, we also have moments when life knocks us down. But just like Jesus got back up, we can also keep going with help from others. It reminds me that when someone falls or feels discouraged we should offer to help them.



**Example: Station 14 –
Jesus Rises from the Dead**

I chose this Station because it reminds me that no matter how hard life gets, there is always hope. In my artwork, I drew a hospital at sunrise. A child inside is feeling better after being sick, and a nurse outside is walking home after helping people through the night. This reminds me of Jesus rising from the tomb – bringing light, healing, and new life. Even when things feel dark or scary, God is always working to bring goodness in the end. The Resurrection helps me remember that we are never alone, and that joy always

4. Various answers, for example:
I wrote a postcard to my grandma when I was on holiday. (simple past)
I had written a postcard to my grandma when I arrived in Spain. (past perfect)
I write letters to my pen pal who lives in Germany. (simple present)
5. Sentence B is written in the past perfect form because it uses 'had' with the irregular past participle 'taken'. It describes an action that was completed in the past before another action happened. The last cookie was taken before anyone noticed it was gone.
6. Various answers, for example: C could be the odd one out because it is a form of present tense, whereas A and B are both in a form of future tense. Or A could be the odd one out because it is in the simple tense but B and C are in a perfect form.
