Year 5 Chat It: Lesson 1

Recognising Negative Behaviour



Background:

Sometimes, it can be difficult for children to see the similarities between negative behaviour offline and negative behaviour online. By giving children the opportunity to explore similar scenarios which are happening both online and offline, they will feel more confident in reporting behaviour which makes them feel uncomfortable.

Key Concepts	1. Recognising a 'gut feeling'. 2. Knowing how to report something if it makes you feel uncomfortable. 3. You are not responsible for the actions of others. If something makes you feel uncomfortable, it is not your fault.
Badge Descriptors	 I can recognise unacceptable behaviour online. I can report things I see online which make me feel uncomfortable. I understand that it is important to consider other people's feelings when communicating online.

Glossary	
claps	This is Natterhub's way of showing that you approve of, enjoy or agree with a post. Children can clap anything which another user has written or shared on Natterhub.
comments	This is the term used whenever a user is replying to a post made by either themselves or somebody else. All comments will appear together with the original post. The end result may look like a discussion.
Natterhub alert button	This is the button offered within the Natterhub platform where a pupil can alert any uncomfortable, untoward or inappropriate content to a teacher so that they can be made aware of the issue.
post	This is something which a user has shared on social media. It may be text they have written or something they have shared, such as a photo or a video. A post on Natterhub will be visible to all other users within the class.
trusted adult	This is the term used for a responsible person whom the pupil trusts for good advice and solutions related to social media. This person will not chastise the child for going wrong but act as a source of good and reliable suggestions of how to behave and what to do in difficult situations.
