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


Which one are you?

The government announced this week that schools will receive an extra £4.5bn a year, taking the funding for each pupil in England to its highest ever level. This includes £615 million to support SEND pupils and £1.3 billion for buildings. Belvoirdale have met with Leicestershire leaders over recent weeks and asked for more help to support our work with all pupils, including those with extra needs and we have also asked for more space to cope with increasing numbers (now 334).
