

Uniform - Children are all expected to wear the Tudor Court uniform with black shoes. No white trainers or any other coloured trainers are allowed in school.


- No jewellery is allowed to be worn in school.

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

Our Curriculum

- We have four cycles of the year.
- 2 history cycles and 2 geography cycles.
- **History Enquiry questions are:**
- Should the Benin Bronzes be returned to Nigeria.
- How have British Monarchs' powers changed over time?
- **Geography:**
- Where does our food come from?
- Why do we need lines on a world map?

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Reading

Children are expected to read at least 3 times a week for a period of 20 minutes at a time and sign their home communication book. Books are checked weekly and reading rewards are given.

Important for test paper and stamina

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Assessment and progress

- Children are assessed termly and results will be sent home.
- Weekly Spelling tests are taken in class.
- In class mini-assessment to check progress and understanding.

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Communication with the school regarding your child

- We are hoping to also visit Neasden Temple in London in the spring term.
- In the summer term, we are planning to visit Greenwich Royal Observatory as part of our Geography learning.
- Adult support is crucial for these trips to go ahead and we would appreciate your support.

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Home –school support

Christmas Production

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Mobile Phones

What we're giving isn't just a phone, it's a portal to an unpredictable, adult world we have very little control over. Children are finding themselves sucked into the devices, spending less time playing with friends and more time staring at a screen. They also introduce comparison, social pressure, addiction and exposure to content their brains aren't yet equipped to process.

Signs your child may not be ready yet:

- Difficulty switching off screens without a reaction
- Low tolerance to frustration
- Poor impulse control or high anxiety after screen time
- Seeking approval or reassurance often

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Mobile Phones

Only to be bought to school if your child is travelling home by themselves.

While digital communication can be beneficial, it's crucial to ensure our children's safety online.

As parents, it is your responsibility to:

- Regularly check your child's WhatsApp conversations
- Monitor group chats they're a part of
- Discuss online safety and appropriate behaviour
- Set guidelines for WhatsApp usage
- Be aware of who your child is communicating with
- Remember, active parental involvement is key to creating a safe digital environment for our children
