






School Attendance - Ongoing Reporting.

The information below shows that whole school attendance for the dates between 6th September 2021 and 6th April 2022 is currently 91.2%, static from when we reported 2 weeks ago. This is below the expected attendance rate of 96% or higher.





Changes to measures and guidance for managing COVID-19 in education and childcare settings from Friday 1 April.

On 29th March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April. Universal testing also ended from 1st April 2022. The advice on the government website above states;

1. Adults with the symptoms of a respira

tory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should **try** to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.

- 2. children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- 3. adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
- 4. Regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting and the school has been instructed by the Department for Education to not distribute any test kits to pupils or staff.

The government website states that the population now has much stronger protection against COVID-19 than at any other point in the pandemic.
