We're inviting Year 5 parents/carers to join us for lunch Week commencing 12th January. Lunch will begin around 12:40 pm (some classes may be slightly later).



Online safety

We have had reports of some children going on phone apps and getting bullied online over the holidays.

Please look at [App Reviews, Kids Apps | Common Sense Media](#) to get clear guidance on which are safe to use for different ages.

Unsupervised time on apps is evidenced to be bad for children's mental health and wellbeing. There is also a very real risk of abuse, including bullying.



Mr Fraser says, "From a safeguarding point of view criminals and those with ill-intent use apps to target children. For my own child, they will not get a smartphone before they are a teen. I would advise you to do the same."

Earrings and jewellery

Please can any pierced ears only have small sleepers or studs in them. Anything more can risk injury during playtime, PE lessons or clubs.

Other jewellery (unless religious) should not be worn in school, this includes rings, bracelets and necklaces. Please keep special things like this for out of school wear-they could get lost, damaged or cause injury during PE or play.
