Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been full of exciting projects and opportunities for our pupils to grow as thoughtful, responsible members of both our school and wider community.

On **Tuesday**, our School Council and Rights Respecting Ambassadors took part in a very important project: a **whole-school Waste Audit**, led by Alex Mack from *Resource Future*. This work is the start of our journey to improving the way we manage waste as part of our Climate Action Plan—something now required of all schools, and something we are proud to be tackling.

The team collected, weighed, and sorted through a day's worth of rubbish from across the school. In the general waste, there were whole unopened packets of crisps and chocolate bars, as well as many items that could have been recycled. In the recycling, we found lots of non-recyclables, including over **2kg of paper towels!** Perhaps most worrying, we learned that if just one bag is wrongly sorted, the whole bag may be burned—destroying precious natural resources. This was a real eye-opener for everyone.

Our aim now is clear: to reduce, reuse, and recycle wherever possible. When Alex returns in November, we'll be creating labels and posters to help raise awareness and remind everyone of the importance of correct waste disposal. This is just the beginning—please look out for ways you can support us at home, too.

On **Thursday 2nd October**, Haldon and Hedgemoor classes enjoyed a special **PSHE Day** with the theme *"Together at the Table."* Children took part in activities exploring how eating together helps us build kindness, respect, and friendships. Hedgemoor made posters which will be shared in the dining hall to remind others about good table manners and ways to ensure meal times are a happy place for everyone.

A reminder that **next Friday** we would love to invite you to join us for a fun **Scarecrow-Making Afternoon!** If you have spare clothes, a bag of straw, or other scarecrow supplies, please bring them along—more details to follow. We are also looking forward to our **Whippletree farm trips next week**, which will give pupils further opportunities to learn about nature and sustainability. Finally, a big shout out to our **Y5/6 Football Team** who are playing their first match of the year against Rydon Primary School after school today. Go Christow!

# School Waste Audit



The School Council and Rights Respecting Ambassadors got involved in a really important project on Tuesday. Led by Alex Mack from 'Resource Future', we started our journey to becoming better at managing our school's waste. This is a crucial aspect of our school's Climate Action Plan; now a legal requirement of all school's as of this September, and quite rightly so!

As a team we weighed and sorted through rubbish from one day's worth of bins. Lucia helped to label all bin bags from around the school, and we were shocked by some of the contents! In our general waste, the team found whole, unopened packs of crisps and chocolate bars along with many items that could have been recycled. Likewise, in our recycling bins, we found many items that couldn't be recycled, including over 2kg worth of paper towels! I was surprised to hear that paper towels couldn't be recycled. We were all shocked to hear that whole bags of rubbish, if incorrectly sorted, would go straight to the furnace for burning. To contextualise, Alex said, 'That's parts of our natural world; trees, rocks and other natural materials, all being burnt.'

As a school, we want to do our best to reduce, reuse and recycle as much waste as possible. This project will kickstart our efforts towards this and when Alex returns in early November, we will be going label and poster mad in attempt to educate and raise the profile of correct waste disposal across the school!
