## Focus on English

More than any other subject, English – and especially reading – gives pupils access to the rest of the curriculum and is fundamental to their educational success. This is why the introduction to the national curriculum says: 'Fluency in the English language is an essential foundation for success in all subjects'.

But English is so much more than the gateway to success in other curriculum subjects. Through studying literature, pupils' eyes are opened to the human experience; they explore meaning and ambiguity as well as the beauty and power of language. English also has a strong creative and expressive dimension. A strong command of the spoken word is a crucial outcome of English education. The benefits of spoken language extend beyond just success at school. Becoming an articulate, effective communicator forms the basis of democratic engagement within wider society.

Through our analysis of homework completion, it has shown that pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9 have some limited completion of their English homework which is designed to further enhance the learning in class. Following pupil feedback on Bedrock which we were using we have moved to Sparx reader to align with Maths. This programme is very easy to use and has the following benefits:

- Pupils can choose from a range of texts
- Everyone can be successful in their reading through personalised targets
- Regular quizzes help to check understanding and develop comprehension
- Books from home and the library can be added.
