I hope that everybody had a good Easter and found some time to relax and unwind. The children have been enjoying learning about their new topics across the curriculum. It is always wonderful to visit classrooms and see the very good behaviour for learning of the children and their enthusiasm for learning.

This week the site set up has begun for the building work. The contractors will be holding assemblies for the children to discuss the work and keeping safe in and around the site. They will also be sending letters to parents/carers and the wider community with information about the building programme. The children have been fantastic and enjoyed seeing the diggers coming on to site. The building work is projected to be completed by mid-October. I know that change always causes apprehension amongst children and parents. This expansion was something the school wanted for us to move away from mixed aged classes in the school. The mixed aged classes have many positives and have worked well thanks to the hard work of staff and children. However, it does cause issues and the chance to move back to single aged classes was something we could not turn down. It is also a significant benefit for our community to have one of the largest schools in North West Leicestershire. In the next academic year, we will have three EYFS classes, Three Year 1 classes and three Year 2 classes. Year 3 and Year 4 classes will be mixed as the 'bulge years' work through the school. Year 5 will have two classes as will Year 6. Staffing for the classes will not be considered until after the end of May, the end of May is the last time for teachers to hand in their notice should they wish to.

Thank you for your support with parking along the front of the school. Since my message last week the yellow lined area in front of the school to the crossroads has been clear. I think we have all noticed that it being clear has enabled the traffic to flow far more freely with less congestion. I know there are concerns about a lack of crossing patrol since Mrs Fletcher retired from this post. We share the concerns and have asked the local authority for a replacement but they have been unwilling to recruit. Please do send your concerns to the local authority on this matter.

We are planning to hold an 'open' meeting for residents, parents/carers, councillors and the Police to discuss options for parking. We would like to offer park and stride facilities from a car park or area of land, but we have struggled to find anywhere suitable. Therefore, we would like to hold a meeting to gather thoughts and opinions on the way forward for the future. I will send dates for the event out soon.

Although it doesn't feel as if it is the summer we are in the summer term! This is always a very busy term with many events and activities for the children. It has been wonderful to hear our Year 3 children rehearsing for their Vocalease performance in May. Please check the dates for the diary carefully in the newsletter and on Weduc.


Lunchtimes

Pastoral Information

Pastoral Team:

Sometimes children can need a little bit of extra support emotionally in school. This can be support to help with self-regulation, understanding emotions, support with friendship issues through to support as a result of trauma e.g. bereavement. Work may be short term or longer term. This is dependent on the child and/or family's needs.

We have a team who work throughout the school with children of all ages who need additional provision to classroom support. Currently our pastoral team is:

Miss Louise Galdes- Emotional support, family support worker who often works one to one with children and their families

Mrs Vicky Senior- ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) and a qualified Drawing and Talking Practitioner. May work with individual children or groups.

Mrs Julie Burke- ELSA. May work with individual children or groups.

Mrs Verna Hill - School Counsellor

Miss Nicky Walker- Pastoral Leader

Concerns about a child's wellbeing can be expressed from the adults working at school or of course from parents and carers. Any concerns you may have about your child or children should first be shared with their class teacher in the first instance who will pass on the information to the Pastoral Team. If you feel that you wish to discuss your child's wellbeing with a Senior member of staff Miss Walker is a point of contact.

Support with sleeping, nutrition and healthy life, physical health, behaviour and toileting should be discussed with either your GP or School Nurse who are the relevant professionals to support with all health concerns.
