- there are 26 letters
- there are over 150+ graphemes (letter combinations)

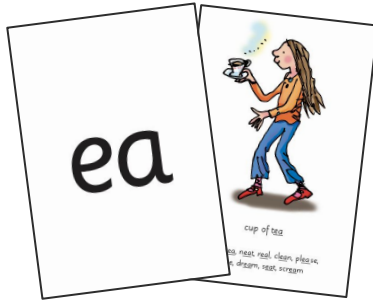

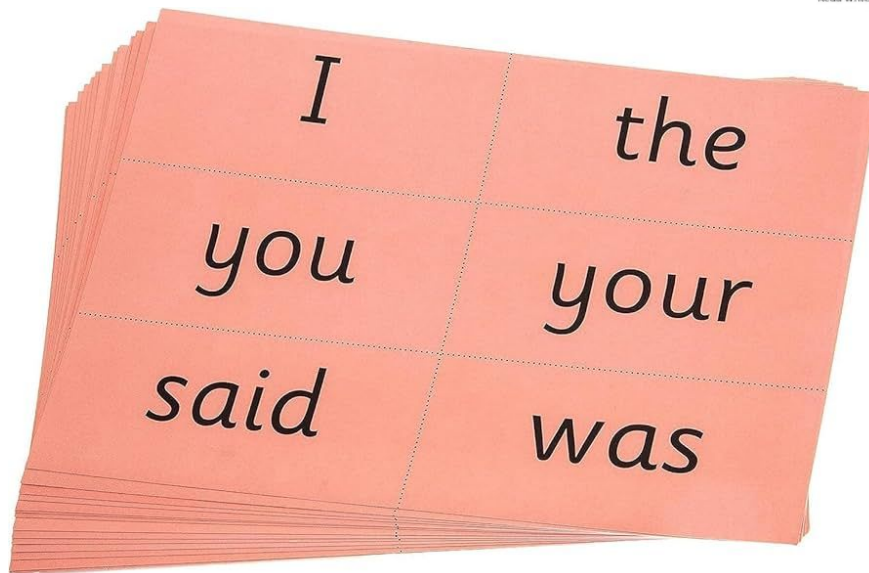
Ask children to practise reading the words across the rows, down the columns and in and out of order clearly and quickly.

How do I use the Virtual Classroom?

1. Set aside 10 minutes to watch a film with your child each day.
2. Find a quiet space for your child to watch the film on a laptop or tablet.
3. Praise your child as they join in with the lesson - make it fun!


The more they practise using these films, the quicker they'll learn to read.

- Helps children to make even more progress.

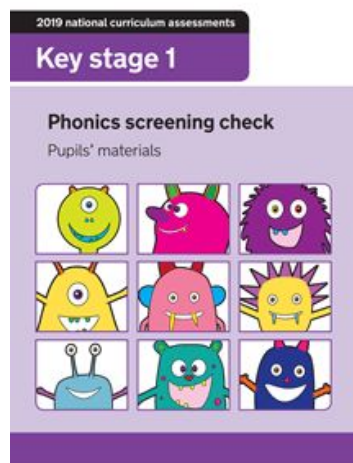






What can I do?

1. Watch the sound production videos for parents so that you are using 'soft sounds'.
2. Practise the sounds and phrases.
3. Practise reading sounds speedily.
4. Help your child use 'Special Friends', 'Fred Talk' to read words.
5. Watch the Virtual Classroom films together.

Phonics Screening Check

- This takes place in the Summer term of Year 1 and it set externally.
- All children who are eligible, complete this phonics check with an adult in school.
- The children's score are reported to the government.
- Retake in Year 2 if they do not pass.
