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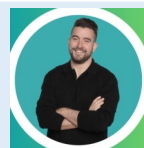
**School Attendance=93.5% National Attendance=96% Persistent Absence = 9%**

Here's an odd way to begin a school newsletter, but it is the best way that I can describe how I am feeling. The picture of the National Theatre on the South Bank in London, (one of my favourite buildings in the world), built in the late 1950's and early 1960's is a brilliant example of **Brutalism architecture**, which is a mid-20th-century architectural style known for massive, blocky forms, raw concrete (béton brut) and exposed structural elements, *emphasizing function and material honesty*. This is exactly how the children reacted to me when I returned to school this week following the death of my father. *"Is your dad dead?"* was the common and functional question and *"yes"* was my honest reply. **If only life was so simple.** I love children when they are so direct with their interpretations and questions! Most of these conversations ended with a hug, a smile and *"we missed you Mr. Dax."* **Returning to school this week to be with the children, my colleagues and the kindness of parents, has been the perfect tonic for me and I am forever grateful. I often spoke to the children about my father in assemblies when we discussed themes that linked to our Life Skills Learning such as grief, illness, memory kindness and families. Making links to real life people and situations is so important to support our teaching because it makes the learning immediate and present for the children. ## £200 Million to support training for SEND

The government announced £200 million for SEND teacher training last week and as we all await the government's SEND white paper, the Department for Education (DfE) has announced that the money would "upskill all staff in every school, college and nursery". The government's SEND code of practice will also be updated as the government strives to increase inclusion in mainstream schools in a bid to tackle the SEND crisis. What has been obvious to everyone at Belvoirdale over recent years is the extra demands on teachers to deepen their knowledge of how to adapt their teaching to meet a wide range of needs. Training will also be used for pupils for with speech and language needs and visual impairments; all of which we are proud to be doing already. However, what is important to remember that we have to constantly adapt and rethink our ways of working to help all students.
