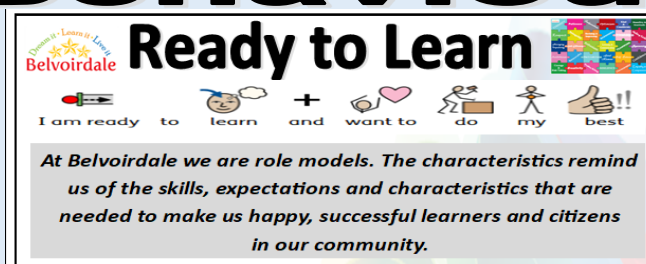

Golden Rules

The Belvoirdale Golden Rules have been updated and refined. They are displayed in all classroom and are the very foundations of being prepared for learning and school as well as being good citizens.



Behaviour



Our behaviour system and policy has been reviewed and updated and your child will be receiving detailed information in class and in assemblies about the changes. It is based on the updated GOLDEN RULES that use positive reinforcement to support and celebrate good choices. The FOUR step system is displayed in every classroom (Acorn/Cedar have small variations) and allows every child to correct their behaviour. All children begin each morning and afternoon with their name in the Ready to Learn box at the top of the chart. Dojos are awarded for excellence and no longer taken away. A detailed explanation including posters was sent home this week. The Behaviour Policy (draft) is available to read on the school website.
