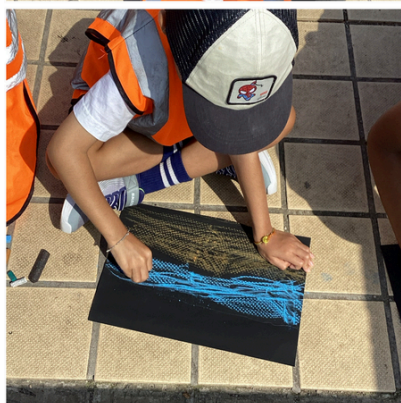
An absolutely fantastic day was had by everyone, well done Willow Class!

They also discussed the different ways that the children can stay safe and protect themselves online, including the importance of age rating for apps and the reasons for these.



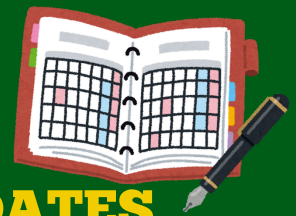
These keen singers joined with other local primary and secondary school children this week to take part in the Big Summer Sing at the Leas Cliff Hall!
