Maths	This week we have been learning how to measure in cm and mm. The children know that there are 10mm in 1cm and can use this knowledge to understand that $34\text{mm} = 3\text{cm and } 4\text{mm}$.
Arithmetic Test- Tuesday	This test will be a mix of three-digit addition and subtraction.
Spelling Test- Thursday	This spelling test will be on words which sound like they are spelt 'ai'/'ay' but actually spelt 'ei'.




