

# **School Attendance - Ongoing Reporting**

The information overleaf shows that whole school attendance for the dates between 6th September 2021 and 14th July 2022 is currently **91.9%**, static on when we reported 1 week ago.







This is still below the expected attendance rate of **96% or higher.** The national average for attendance in state funded primary schools was **90.9%** to 7 July 2022, Wynstream Primary School is **1% higher than** this national average. This is a good result, but we strive to exceed the expected rate of 96%. Thank you parents and school staff who have been working hard to get this figure moving in the right direction.



Year 3 had a wonderful day visiting the River Exe, the children were exceptionally well behaved. Despite the heat, they enjoyed walking the length of the River from Salmonpool Weir to the Quay and back again. They loved seeing all the flood defenses that we had been learning about.
