Dear Parent/Carer,

This Monday we welcomed Revd Canon Dodie Marsden to lead our Collective Worship about the environment and creation. Dodie then worked with Year 1/2 talking to the children about our partnership with Kyankowe. The children asked lots of questions about our partnership school in Africa comparing similarities and differences between our own and Kyankowe's community. Dodie will soon fly out to Uganda to give our alphabet book of the United Kingdom, that Year 6 created, to the children in Kyankowe.

On Wednesday, we were delighted to support the St. Mary's church team inviting in one of the candidates for the new vicar's job in Kingsclere. The candidate led Collective Worship for the whole school and shared the message of looking after and caring for our world.

This week, staff shared their classes writing work with the Hampshire Local Authority advisor for English. The advisor was impressed with the progress children have made in their writing learning journey so far this academic year and also supported staff in considering how to further develop children's editing skills.

We say farewell to Miss Tamlin, Rowan Class teacher and our Year R, 1 and 2 Phase Leader, and wish her all the very best during her maternity leave. We warmly welcome Mrs Lisa Featherstone and Mrs Voke who will be teachers in Rowan Class from Monday. Mrs Lindsey Bowden will take over the role of Year R, 1 and 2 Phase Leader supporting in leading the Year R, 1 and 2 staff team as well as working in partnership with the children and parents/carers of these year groups.

We have now reviewed our Home Learning with children, staff and parents/carers and below are a few of the changes as a result of the review:

- > We have changed the Deepening Understanding maths homework to a paper copy which many children have instantly told us is 'much better'
- ➤ Children and parents/carers at our parent/carer Home Learning working party asked about different ways to practise spellings. Practising spellings online and on paper are both useful ways to learn spellings. I have attached some strategies that can be used in KS1 and KS2 if children wish to practise their spellings on paper. Spelling Shed also has spelling games which will be useful for children to rehearse their spellings on too
- ➤ There were mixed views on whether work sent home should be called 'Home Learning' or 'Homework'. Following a conversation with our parent/carer Homework Working Party they suggested that the children voted. The children voted and 'Home Learning' was the overall preference!

Home-Start UK is a leading family support charity. They offer support and practical help to families and children facing challenges around mental and physical health, isolation, disability, post-natal depression, money problems and more. A referral can be made to the **Early Help Hub** through your child's school. The Early Help Hub provides support for the whole family and will discuss your concerns with you, offer advice and suggest the relevant support for you and your family.





Supporting Families in Hampshire provide practical help to families to stop problems getting worse. They ask families about the things that are important to them, about the things that might help and can be done to support them. Family Support Service (FSS). The FSS offer single session appointments, courses and one to one work to support families of children and young people aged 0-18yrs with difficulties that are impacting on their lives. You can ask your health visitor, nursery or school to fill in a FSS Level 2 RFS form. This must be signed by both the parent(s) and professional referring.

The **Children's Wellbeing Support Service** provides early intervention and support for parents of children with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs which can present in a similar way to Autism, Attention Deficit Disorder, Attachment Disorder, anxiety and poor emotional wellbeing. Referrals to this service have to be made by a health professional such as your GP. Speak to your GP to find out more information linked to this service.
