Information

- We are blessed with a school full of dedication and talent. This is also the case with leadership (present company excluded of course!). With this in mind, I thought I'd share with you the leadership structure at Kings Road.
- The governors, along with the Local Authority, have overall responsibility for the school. Governors have three core strategic functions, vision, finance and standards. We're very lucky with the governors we have, including, Mr O'Keefe, our Chair of Governors.
- There are 7 of us on the SLT (Senior Leadership Team), myself as Headteacher (and DSL), Miss Grimsley (Deputy Headteacher and DDSL), Four Assistant Headteachers (Miss Hodges, Mrs Hoodless, Miss Hassall and Mrs Walls) and finally our fab SENCO, Miss Barlow.
- Beneath this we have our Assistant Phase Leads, Mrs Ingleson, Miss Jokhia, Miss Bloor, Mrs Abass, Mrs Gibson, Mr Norman and Mrs Bettles.
- The APLs sit on the Excellence Committee – the other members of the Excellence Committee are Mrs Grady, Mr Boothby, Mr Allcock, Mrs Connery, Ms Kaemena, Mr Whitworth and Miss Hollywood Summers.
- All teachers also lead curriculum areas; I'll share this at another time.
- Behaviour at Kings Road is wonderful. I am so proud of the children's attitudes. We do have a lot of awards and incentives in place, but I am a firm believer in inner values being the reason behind making effective choices. In an earlier edition of the KRB, I explained that if a child demonstrates physical violence (for any reason) or swears, they will automatically receive a 'formal consequence'. I think it is important to have a fair, strong and transparent process in place to ensure that standards and expectations of behaviour remain at the highest possible level. The chart below shows the process that is in place for Y2 onwards.

Excellence without compromise

We’ll send invites out in due course and meetings will start at 4pm and last about 30 minutes.
- On Friday 19th September children may wear their own clothes, hopefully wearing jeans (but don’t buy them especially) and donating £1 which will go to the charity, ‘Jean for Genes.’
- We have our first, ‘Day of Peace’ scheduled on Friday 26th September. On this date children (and staff) may wear clothes that celebrate their heritage and/or celebrate peace. Animosity towards other groups of people is not permitted. If this becomes misused, then we may have to reconsider our approach.
