UKS2 PSHE and Citizenship Relationships - TEAM

Guide for Parents and Carers

This term, your child's PSHE and Citizenship topic is TEAM.

This unit entitled TEAM (Together Everyone Achieves More) will focus on the positive qualities of a team. The children will learn how to disagree respectfully and communicate effectively. The children will explore the skills needed for a team to be successful. The lessons will address collaborative learning and will teach the children how to compromise to ensure a task is completed as a team. Children will discuss how we can support and respect members of our team and identify what to do to stop bullying or unkind behaviour from others. The unit will end by addressing the importance of caring for all team members and the shared responsibilities a team has.

We will be exploring the following questions:

- **Lesson 1:** Can we think of any teams that we admire? What are the attributes that make a good team?
- **Lesson 2:** How can we make our views heard without falling out with others? How can we respond respectfully to other people's feelings and opinions?
- **Lesson 3:** How can we compromise and work collaboratively? How can this help our team?
- **Lesson 4:** How can we be sensitive to the feelings of others? How can we make other people feel valued?
- **Lesson 5:** What is unkind behaviour? How can we support people who are being upset by others?
- **Lesson 6:** Why are responsibilities important in a team? What are the most important responsibilities for our team?

Your child will be taking part in a range of activities, including the following:

Creating a collage as a team, writing a letter to express their opinion, creating a song collaboratively, planning a party using compromise, creating cards to show care for others and listing specific responsibilities of members in a team.

About PSHE and Citizenship Education

PSHE stands for Personal, Social, Health and Economic education. It is an important part of the school curriculum that aims to teach children the knowledge and skills that they need to stay safe, happy and healthy, while preparing them for their life ahead.
