What is the remote learning guide?

Where students are unable to attend school due to, medical, or disciplinary reasons we will continue to provide resources to enable students to continue their education at home – we call this remote learning. We want to minimise the impact to your child's education and therefore we have a plan to make sure learning can continue when they are unable to attend school.

We will be providing all teaching resources through Microsoft Teams. All students will be automatically placed in a Team for their classes in all subjects. Teachers will place all activities, including lessons and resources as files in these Teams. Pupils can access the Teams through their school email accounts. Teachers will also set homework and send messages to their pupils using MS Teams. All work will be available before the lesson is due to start.

You can see a summary of what is being taught each week through the remote learning guides that are shared on the school website every Friday. The guides are also shared with students on their year group's MS Teams. Your child's teachers will also be available via email to answer any questions or queries your child may have. The email address for the head of each department is also included within this guide if you need to contact them regarding any subject related issue.

What is your child learning this term?

Unit 1: Human Lifespan Development (Exam unit)

This unit introduces patterns of growth and development, factors affecting health (genetic, environmental, social, and financial), and key theories explaining behaviour throughout life. Students will examine predictable and unpredictable life events, the ageing process, and its impact on confidence and self-esteem. The unit is externally assessed and forms the foundation of the qualification, covering health and social care needs across different life stages.

Unit 4: Enquiries into Current Research in Health and Social Care (Exam unit)

Pupils explore the methodologies of contemporary research and investigate the implications for health and social care practice and services.

Unit 12: Supporting Individuals with Additional Needs (Assignment unit)

In this unit, students will gain specialist knowledge to provide high-quality care while promoting equality, diversity, and inclusion. They will learn to identify different types of additional needs and understand their impact on wellbeing, rights, and access to services. They will explore how organisations work together through multi-agency support, investigate strategies and services that help individuals overcome daily challenges, and understand the legislation, frameworks, and policies that protect the rights of people with additional needs.

This term, students will explore the foundational principles and key concepts that underpin the legal system, gaining insight into its structure, purpose, and societal role. They will learn how laws are developed, interpreted, and applied, and examine the relationship between law and justice. In the area of criminal law, students will investigate various types of criminal offenses, understand the legal defences available to defendants, and follow the procedures involved in criminal trials—from investigation and arrest to prosecution and sentencing. This comprehensive approach will equip students with a solid understanding of how the legal system functions to uphold order and protect rights within society.

What is your child learning this term?

Research methods: Students will learn about how psychological research is planned, carried out and analysed. They will learn about the importance of ethical considerations and the role of Psychology in the economy.

Social Influence - Pupils will explore how individuals are influenced by others, including conformity, obedience, and resistance to social influence. They will examine real-world applications and ethical issues in social influence research.

Attachment - Pupils will study how early attachments form, their influence on later relationships, and the impact of deprivation and privation. They will consider key research and its ethical and practical implications.

What is your child learning this term?		
<u>Component 1 - Socialisation, culture and identity</u> This component introduces pupils to the key themes of socialisation, culture and identity and develops these themes through the context of families and relationships, this option develops skills that enable pupils to focus on their personal identity, roles and responsibilities within society and develop a lifelong interest in social issues. <u>Component 2 - Researching and understanding social inequalities</u> In this component, pupils are introduced to a range of methods and sources of data as well as the factors influencing the design of sociological research and the relationship between theory and methods. Pupils are encouraged to consider the practical, ethical and theoretical issues arising in sociological research and to apply knowledge of research methods to the particular context of social inequalities. Within this component pupils will have the opportunity to develop knowledge and understanding of contemporary patterns and trends of social inequality. Pupils are able to engage in theoretical debate, explore conceptual issues and develop skills of analysis and evaluation of sociological research and evidence.

What is your child learning this term?
<u>Unit 5: Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs (Assignment unit)</u> In this unit, students will develop an understanding of the principles and values that guide quality care and support in health and social care. Students will explore how personalised care is planned, the ethical issues involved, and the challenges professionals face in delivering effective services. Students will learn about different methods used across care settings and the importance of multi-agency working to meet individual needs. By the end of the unit, students will be able to apply these principles to real scenarios, drawing on knowledge from across the course.

Unit 19 – Nutritional Health (Assignment unit)

In this unit, students will explore the importance of good nutrition for health and wellbeing. Students will learn about the nutritional value of food, the role of different nutrients, and how individual dietary needs vary. They will examine factors that influence nutritional health, such as lifestyle, culture, and medical conditions, as well as issues like obesity and diabetes. Finally, they will develop practical skills by creating a nutritional health improvement plan, preparing them for careers such as dietitian, nutrition consultant, or educator, and providing a strong foundation for further study in health and social care.

What is your child learning this term?

This term, students will gain a foundational understanding of the nature of law, including the key principles and concepts that shape the legal system, its structure, and its role in society. They will explore how laws are created, interpreted, and applied to maintain justice and order.

In the study of **tort law**, students will examine various types of civil wrongs—such as negligence and defamation—and learn about the legal remedies available to individuals who suffer harm due to the actions of others. Additionally, students will investigate the legal framework surrounding **human rights**, including relevant legislation, landmark case studies, and the ways in which human rights are protected and enforced both nationally and internationally. This comprehensive approach will help students develop a well-rounded understanding of how the law impacts individuals and society.

Students will also continue to revisit past topics through retrieval practice and examination questions.

Forensic Psychology - Pupils will learn how psychology explains criminal behaviour and informs approaches to offender profiling, sentencing, and rehabilitation. They will explore ethical considerations and the role of forensic psychology in the criminal justice system.

Relationships – Pupils will learn about factors that affect attraction, various theories of how relationships form and how why they break down. Pupils will also look at virtual and parasocial relationships.

What is your child learning this term?

Component 3 - Debates in contemporary society

This component engages students in theoretical debates and how these relate to a contemporary global society. The component will develop knowledge and understanding of social processes and social change. It develops links between the topics studied in this component, the nature of sociological thought, contemporary social policy and the core themes. Contemporary and global debates are introduced through a compulsory topic of '**Globalisation and the Digital Social World**' in Section A, whilst Section B explores them in more depth from a detailed study of '**Crime and Deviance**'. The social construction of crime and deviance are considered and the ways in which crime is socially distributed, explained and reduced. This option introduces a global dimension, with reference to patterns and trends. It aims to give an understanding of different theoretical approaches to the study of crime and deviance.

Students will also continue to revisit past topics through retrieval practice and examination questions.
