School Uniform – please ensure that your child is wearing correct school uniform

Winter – Green coat, green jumper(with school logo), white shirt (no polo shirts), school tie, charcoal grey school trousers (shades of grey and black not acceptable) and black shoes. Bottle Green winter hats and scarves are permitted Summer – white shirt, school tie, charcoal grey shorts and black shoes. PE kit –white t-shirt (with school logo), blue shorts, trainers, blue Sweatshirt (with school logo) tracksuit bottoms.

In the interests of health and safety, long hair MUST be tied back. Hair that is longer than COLLAR LENGTH (girls and boys) must be tied back. No fashion or unusual haircuts and of minimum grade 2 for boys please.

Only green or black hairbands/ribbons are permitted – No other fashion hair accessories.

No jewellery of any kind except watches which can be worn.

Ear-rings should be pierced at the beginning of the Summer holidays to allow time to heal. Children may only wear studs in school which must be removed for PE.

Please note that smart watches or devices eg Fitbits are not allowed in school.

KIRFs

- KIRFs or Key Instant Recall Facts support the mental skills and key knowledge that children need to secure for Maths. They include number bonds and times tables, and are particularly useful in developing confidence and understanding in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- These will be added to our class page on the website every half term so that you can support your child with building fluency with these concepts. This will enable them to apply this knowledge to other areas of Mathematics and to develop higher order thinking, problem solving and reasoning.
- We recommend that you spend 5-10 minutes a day working on these at home as often as you can.

Children will sit tests the week beginning: Monday 11th May 2025

Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation – **Monday**Reading – **Tuesday**

Maths – Wednesday & Thursday

Key Stage 2 tests

We will publish KS2 test results in your child's end of year report in July. Each pupil registered for the tests will receive:

- A raw score (number of raw marks awarded)
- A scaled score
- Confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard



SATs cont.

Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation:

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts: a grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes, and an aural spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes.

Reading:

The reading test will be a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. Your child will have one hour, including reading time, to complete the test.



SATs cont.

Maths:

Children will sit three papers in maths: Paper 1: arithmetic, 30 minutes, Papers 2 & 3: reasoning, 40 minutes per paper. Paper 1 will consist of fixed response questions, where children have to give the correct answer to calculations, including long multiplication and division.

Papers 2 & 3 will involve a number of question types, including: multiple choice, true or false, constrained questions, e.g. giving the answer to a calculation, drawing a shape or completing a table or chart, less constrained questions, where children will have to explain their approach for solving a problem.
