National Curriculum KS1

Pupils should be taught:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, ;line, shape, form and space
- about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between practices and disciplines and making links to their own work.
