The Coombeshead Commitment – developing Character 2021-23

At Coombeshead Academy we are committed to the development of the knowledge, skills and talents of every individual. We do this primarily by providing a broad and rich formal curriculum coupled with a strong focus on the Personal Development of our students through a rich life skills and extra-curricular programme.

The Coombeshead Commitment is a detailed programme of opportunities available to ALL students as part of our commitment to developing the 'whole self' (CHARACTER). We are wholly committed to the principle of an enriched and far reaching extra-curricular experience. We want our students to have a range of experiences which are not just the preserve of those living in affluent areas and or those who attend independent schools.

We believe that as we reach beyond the formal taught curriculum we can build the confidence of our young people through the commitment to an entitlement based extra-curricular offer where all students get the opportunity to explore wider experiences and develop talents.

As a Rights Respecting school our Coombeshead Commitment is underpinned by the United Nations Convention on Human Rights:

Article 15

• You have the right to be with friends and join or set up clubs, unless this breaks the rights of others.

Article 28

• You have the right to education.

Article 29

• You have the right to education which tries to develop your personality and abilities as much as possible and encourages you to respect other people's rights and values and to respect the environment.

Article 31

• Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.

In order to develop the confidence, self-esteem and resilience of our students as well as to build on their human rights we focus on the following 4 areas:

- A broad and enriched curriculum experience which encapsulates but also goes beyond the formal curriculum experience.
- Access to a broad range of cultural experiences which nurtures and develops creativity.
- Opportunities to develop **leadership** skills
- A focus on health and wellbeing in order to improve life opportunities
