EYFS Pre-school	Art available every day. A wide range of materials are used. Paint, glue, collage, chalk and painting with water, we also introduce 3D models via junk modelling. Preschool try to ensure all activities are child led and it is their interpretation of an idea. Art activities are often linked to the seasons, national events (e.g. Christmas) and topics.					
EYFS Nursery	Nursery have child led creative activities out all of the time in the continuous provision using a range of mediums and techniques and linked to their weekly theme. They also have an adult directed art activity each week which links to their weekly theme and they have drawing club once a week which is sometimes directed and sometimes child led.					
EYFS Reception	Art and Design available every day during continuous provision. A wide range of materials are used - paint, paint pens, collage, chalk, painting with water, junk modelling, clay and printing making with stencils/sponges. Reception also has art lessons linked to their topics.
