

School Attendance - Ongoing Reporting

The information above shows that whole school attendance for the dates between 7th October 2022 and 14th October is currently 94.6%, much improved on the 91.9% statistic we reported on for the end of last term. This is slightly up, 0.5% versus the 94.1% attendance reported last week.
