Subject Specific Vocabulary

Traditional Tale	A story that has been retold over many years. Sometimes called a fairy tale.
Character	A person or thing on a story
Main character	The person or thing the story is about
Setting	Where a story happens/takes pace
Sequence	The order in which a story is told
Plot	The sequence of events in the story
Trick	A cunning act to deceive someone
Moral	A lesson to learn (from a story)
Trust	To believe someone when they say something
Villain	A character that might be mean or do wrong things
Traditional Tale	A story that has been retold over many years. Sometimes called a fairy tale.

Who are the characters?	Where is the story set?
What happens at the beginning, the middle and the end?	Which is your favourite, and why?
