Key Topics Include:

- Spotting Online Threats: Learn about the most common tactics used by cybercriminals and how they target young people.
- Social Media Safety: Understand the risks surrounding sextortion, disinformation, influencers, AI, privacy, and hacked accounts.
- Parental Controls: Explore the debate on children's access to technology and social media, and discover steps parents can take to minimise harm from device usage.
- Gaming: Understand the risks young people face when gaming online and discover ways to monitor and restrict usage.
- Cybersecurity Essentials: Learn best practices for securing your family's accounts, including password management, two-factor authentication, and other protective measures.

Online Safety - Roblox

We have been made aware of a pop-up appearing on Roblox that encourages children to download an app called Pollybuzz/Pollyfuzz. While it may seem harmless at first, the app can quickly expose children to extreme and inappropriate content.

Please remind your child:

- Do not click on pop-ups in games
- Report anything worrying or inappropriate to a trusted adult

Roblox offers parental controls, which can help reduce risks. Guidance on setting these up can be found within the 'Parental Controls Overview' in Roblox.


Please note that parental controls will block some pop-ups, but not all, so active supervision remains important.



Reading Rewards

Each week, children who read four or more times have their name entered into a class pot. At the end of the week, the teacher picks names at random, and those selected enjoy a reward! These rewards have been chosen by the children in their classes, including rewards such as:

- · eating lunch with their teacher and a friend
- · sitting in the teacher's chair for a lesson
- · choosing a class story or activity

As long as your child reads on four separate days during the week, they will be eligible. Children may read:

- · their school reading book
- · a book from home
- · a library book from the school, village, or town

Children or parents and carers can note reading experiences in the reading journal or on Seesaw (for older children), so we can celebrate their efforts!

Across the school, the number of children reading four or more times a week has increased by 10% - a fantastic achievement. Well done, everyone, and keep up the brilliant reading!

Grounds Day

The whole school took part in Grounds Day, which provided a rich opportunity for outdoor learning across a wide range of subjects including Geography, Art, PSHE, English and Science. Children were able to revisit previous learning while also engaging with new content.

Throughout the day, pupils took part in a variety of activities designed to deepen their understanding and develop practical skills. Some classes enjoyed parachute games. Others created a nativity scene using natural materials, connecting their outdoor experience to RE. Many children explored the school grounds to identify deciduous and evergreen leaves, building their knowledge in Science, while other groups designed and labelled river scenes, learning about the physical features of a river in Geography. Children also practised using coordinates, drawing links between Maths and Geography. In addition, several classes worked together to construct hedgehog homes, an activity that encouraged teamwork and connected closely with PSHE.


















Tesco Tokens

Every token brings us closer to securing vital grant funding towards our new Trim Trail - a fantastic resource that will help our children stay active, healthy, and happy.






Inclusion and Diversity
