Sun Safety



YEAR 9 COOMBESHEAD SCHOLARS - SIXTH FORM




YEAR 12 WORK EXPERIENCE - SIXTH FORM


YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE


For those Y10 students in school, they have been completing workshops on employment skills such as CV writing. Students have also had the opportunity to engage in virtual work experience as well.


ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES





The students were given a tour of the premises and they learnt about the multiple services provided by this local charity. They also helped packing some food parcels alongside the volunteers there. Our students were praised for their impeccable conduct and effective teamwork. It has been a positive and insightful experience for all involved, a practical example of community engagement that we'd like to develop further.



THE HUMAN LIBRARY

The diversity work in school aims to educate students by providing them with the knowledge to understand and respect differences. It is also about celebrating and valuing the diverse identities represented within our school community. Students are invited to give presentations about their personal experience, based on the 'human library' concept that helps to challenge prejudices through open conversations. For example this term Elliott (Year 7) kindly agreed to share his story as a disabled student and wheelchair user. Ini (Year 10), who is from Zimbabwe, presented about the history and significance of African braided hair. Aisha (Year 9) explained the secret language of henna, linked to her family heritage in Qatar and Sri Lanka.

These sessions have proved very popular, watch this space for more of them being organised in the next academic year.


The schools involved look forward to continuing their collaboration with the gallery in future projects that connect learning, the arts, and the environment.
