



Fluency Facts

Target 3-5

I can add a multiple of 10 or 100 to any 2 or 3 digit number

By the end of this half term, you should know the following facts. The aim is to recall these facts **instantly**. You should also be familiar with using the key vocabulary.

Some examples:

$$45 + 10 = 55$$

$$45 + 100 = 145$$

$$36 + 10 = 46$$

$$36 + 100 = 136$$

$$163 + 10 = 173$$

$$163 + 100 = 263$$

$$67 - 10 = 57$$

$$167 - 100 = 67$$

$$784 - 10 = 774$$

$$784 - 100 = 684$$

Including crossing
the tens or
hundreds.

$$198 + 10 = 208$$

$$604 - 10 = 594$$

$$982 + 100 = 1082$$

Key Vocabulary

Subtract

More than

Less than

Carry

Tens

Hundreds

You should also be able to answer missing number questions such as $98 + \dots = 198$.

Top Tips!

- Practise little and often. Use your time wisely – could you practise on the way to school or while waiting in a queue at the supermarket?
- Order of difficulty – Ask your child to order these facts from the easiest to the most challenging. Can they explain why some facts are easier to remember? Then focus on practising the most challenging facts.
- Talk to your child about the 'place value' of each number. For example 567, there are 6 tens so if you add one more ten there will be 7 tens.
- Revisit – You may think you know your target facts after one week, but if you don't practise regularly, you'll soon forget! Keep revisiting old facts regularly to keep them locked in your head!
