## What are the expectations for planning? Is there a set format?

Planning is already in its own format but must be annotated to show amendments. Computing must be included in IGNITE planning grids and long term plans, setting out the curriculum for the year.

If you are not using the Purple Mash planning, it is expected that you complete an individual lesson plan prior to the lesson.

## What are the expectations for assessment? When are assessments due?

Children's work should be sent back to and assessed by the teacher and feedback should be given wherever possible. Setting 2Dos on Purple Mash or having the children save their work in a shared area are the most efficient ways to monitor pupil's activities.

## What are the expectations for marking?

It is expected that verbal feedback is given during sessions and written feedback is provided where appropriate in our online platforms. Feedback (in the form of written comments) and rewards can be given through the 2DO system on Purple Mash.
