




What have we been up to:

Children in Need Day 2024

We held our annual Children in Need fundraising day today demonstrating our school's value of **COMPASSION!** Pupils took part in a carousel of activities: hula hooping, skipping rope, dancing with Pudsey, quizzing and creating their own superhero characters using Al! A huge thank you to Miss Duke for organising all the events of the day and to everyone who made donations or bought a cake at the cake sale. **We raised £161.34 to help make life lighter for children across the UK.**











Christmas has officially arrived in 2/3 this week with a particularly rousing rendition of Silent Night on Glockenspiels... Luckily, we have a few weeks to practise!









At the start of the year, Miss Duke and Mr Nute set each pupil in class 3-4 a reading challenge to read 10 books with the associated Accelerated Reader quiz this term. So far, these amazing pupils have all read at minimum of 10 reading books each and completed the comprehension quiz! We are so proud of their hard-work and determination but mostly we are so pleased that pupils in class 3-4 are discovering a love of reading! Collectively as a class, the pupils have read a whopping 96 books this term with a total of 195,810 words! Utterly FANTASTIC! Well done 3-4!





Class 3/4 have been busy in our DT lessons considering and evaluating; designing and making prototype bird hides after Mrs Tierney set us a challenge! The class realised that their structures were not strong enough with just parallel sides and discovered that a triangle helps make a structure a lot stronger.















Year 6 recited, 'In Flander's Field' by John McCrae as part of our Remembrance service at school. They were so calm and respectful of the event and did a super job!



PCSO Jess- Dartmouth Police visit

Year 5 and 6 were visited by our local Police Community Support Officer, Jess. She talked about how we can keep ourselves safe on our phones and to only send messages that are thoughtful and kind.

Jess also spoke about keeping safe at the park and even if playing rough is a "laugh" or a "joke", it makes the community feel unsafe and the police will intervene. The children were also told what to do if they feel unsure or see something unsafe happen and where to find the police station.

PCSO Jess also spoke about the use of appropriate language in public places and advised pupils that swearing and abusive language is not allowed in public places-just like at school!

She warned pupils about keeping away from the New Cotton Farm playground that is under development as there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour there recently that police are keeping a close eye on.

We also spoke about how our school rules were still in place while pupils were in their school uniform, even if it was outside school and outside of school hours.

All of the children listening intently and asked really good questions. PCSO Jess said she would be increasing her visits to the local park and encouraged pupils to come and say hi when they see her. We will be working with PCSO Jess more closely over the course of the year.




