Reduce, reuse, recycle!



WHAT IS SPD?

Sensory Processing Differences (SPD) are under- or over-stimulation to the senses by things such as sights, sound, smells, and touch.

SPD can be overwhelming to those who have it and is often misunderstood by those who don't.

Those experiencing sensory differences need to use behaviours to regulate themselves such as stimming, jumping, or laying down on the ground. In school settings, these behaviours are often misconstrued, leading to exclusion.

As a token of our appreciation, I have enclosed a certificate that you can proudly share with your community to highlight the contribution made through your event. Please also pass on our thanks to everyone who helped.

Working together to save lives, our team is composed of highly skilled individuals including pilots, paramedics, doctors, engineers and others to ensure that when it comes to emergencies, the people of Devon can count on our crew to provide crucial time-critical care when it is needed most.

In April alone, we were tasked to a total of 166 incidents, that is an average of 5 missions per day. Our helicopters were deployed 115 times, our Critical Care Cars 48 times, plus our Volunteer Responder Team were also called to help on 3 occasions. Our busiest day was Friday.

We respond to emergencies every day of the year, and this is only possible thanks to donations like yours. Together, we are Devon Air Ambulance. Thank you once again for your support.

I am delighted to inform you that we have invited Skipping Workshops to work with our school, teaching different skipping skills to every class.

Skipping Workshops have presented demonstrations in over 3000 schools and are the longest most experienced company in the UK.

To help children & parents interested in encouraging skipping we have a series of brief videos that illustrate various skills & challenges http://www.skipping-workshops.co.uk/videos/

Their aim is to introduce modern and traditional skipping games including individual rope tricks, speed skills and Double Dutch, back into the playground and into the PE curriculum.

The same high quality 'speed ropes' as used by the international team, will be available to buy or order using the form below for £6. The ropes are British made to a high standard, are light and turn easily to allow children and adults to progress rapidly. Colour change solar ropes are £7. Adult ropes are also available for taller children and your personal fitness/weight loss etc at £7 each, 4m 'family ropes' at £9 each and $2 \times 4m$ Double Dutch set for £16.

Ropes will be on sale after school. Card and cash payments accepted.
