Hi! This booklet explains how our school helps children who need extra support. SEND means Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. If learning feels hard, we are here to help!

About Our School

- Our motto is 'Aiming higher, achieving more'. We want everyone to do their best!
- We have 11 classes and about 300 children. Some children need extra help. That's okay!
- 56 children get extra support or have a special plan called an EHCP.

? What is SEND?

- SEND means some children need extra help to learn or feel happy at school.
- This can be help with talking, learning, feelings, or moving around.

Types of Help

- Talking and understanding words, communicating (things like speaking and listening, being autistic)
- Learning and remembering (things like reading, writing, maths)
- Feelings and behaviour (things like feeling worried or upset, having ADHD)
- Senses or body (things like seeing, hearing, moving)

• How Do We Know Who Needs Help?

- Teachers watch and listen to you.
- We talk to parents and check your work.
- Sometimes we use special tests to see what help you need.

Who Helps You?

- Your class teacher helps you every day.
- Mr Westley is our SENDCO he organises extra help.
- Other helpers: teaching assistants, speech and language helpers, play therapist and other people too.

What If I'm Worried?

- You can talk to your teacher or any grown-up you trust.
- Your parents can talk to Mr Westley or Ms Redman too.

How Do We Help You Learn?

- We make lessons clear and fun.
- You might work in a small group or one-to-one.
- We give you breaks if you need them.

Joining In

- You can join in lessons, trips, and clubs like everyone else!
- If you need extra help, we make a plan together.

© Feeling Happy and Safe

- We take bullying very seriously everyone should feel safe.
- We have lessons about kindness and friendship.
- You can talk to an adult if you feel worried.
