However, on very rare occasions the behaviour of a very small minority of parents falls short of what we expect. This sometimes manifests itself in aggression or abuse towards members of the school community. This can be in written communication (**including social media**), on the telephone or in face-to-face incidents.'*

16 June, 4.30pm to 6pm

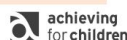

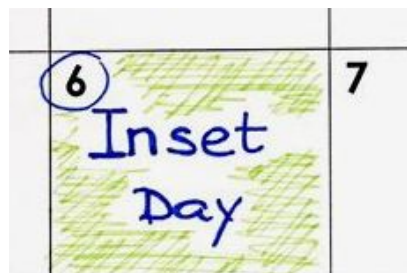
