Dear Parents/ Carers,

It has been another busy week here at Stoke Fleming, and the Spring Term really does seem to be flying by!

This week, our children in Year 4 began their swimming lessons at Dartmouth Leisure Centre. These lessons are a vital part of the curriculum and are particularly important given the beautiful coastal surroundings we live in – and the associated risks. The aim is to ensure that all children can confidently swim at least 25 metres and know how to safely rescue themselves should they ever find themselves in difficulty in water.

On our Facebook page this week, I also shared photographs of our refreshed entrance area and new displays – and they look absolutely fantastic! Our entrance has been transformed into a bright, vibrant and welcoming space that really sets the tone the moment you walk through the door. Even more excitingly, it has become our very own gallery, where we can celebrate children's work, creativity and achievements.

Currently on display are photographs of the bridges designed and built by Class Explorer as part of their Design Technology learning. The children worked incredibly hard on these projects, and it is wonderful to be able to showcase their thinking, teamwork and final outcomes so proudly. Els has completed the first stage of her work at school, and we cannot wait to share further developments and enhancements with you. Next on the list: classrooms, the library and the hall!

Reading at Stoke Fleming

Reading is a very high priority at Stoke Fleming Primary School. Over the last twelve months, we have worked hard to improve our library and provide children with access to hundreds – if not thousands – of high-quality texts. Our aim is to develop a genuine love of reading, which is so key to children's long-term success.

Reading is the first lesson taught across the school every day, from our youngest children to our oldest. However old your child is, we would strongly encourage you to support reading at home – whether that is practising sounds with early readers or sharing several pages of a reading book with more confident readers. Regular reading really does make a significant difference to a child's progress and confidence.

During our Friday celebration assemblies, we also take time to recognise and celebrate the children's hard work, effort and achievements with regards to reading.

Online Safety

Online safety is more important than ever. Research suggests that over 90% of children aged 5–15 regularly use the internet, and many encounter online content or tools powered by artificial intelligence without realising it. While technology offers many benefits, it also brings risks, particularly around privacy, inappropriate content and misinformation.

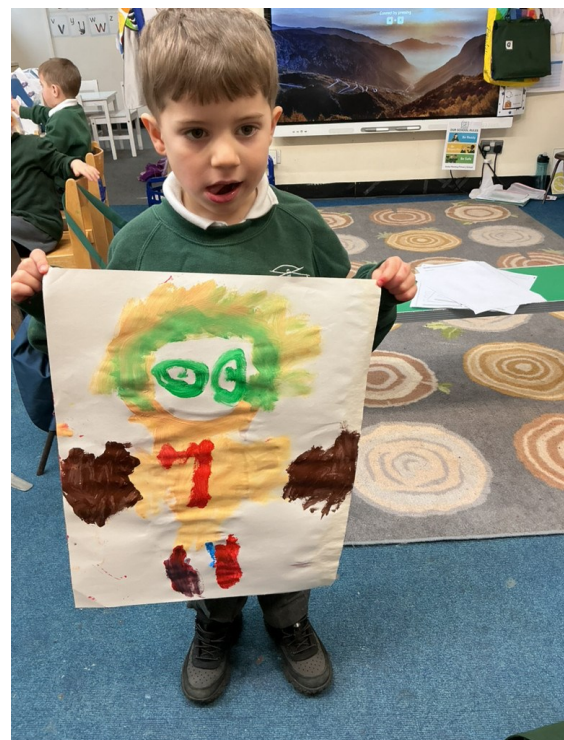
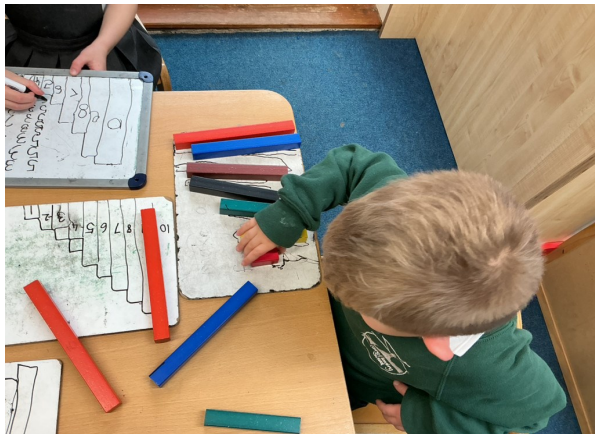


Class Compass

We have been performing a Pirate dance to the tune of 'He's a Pirate'.



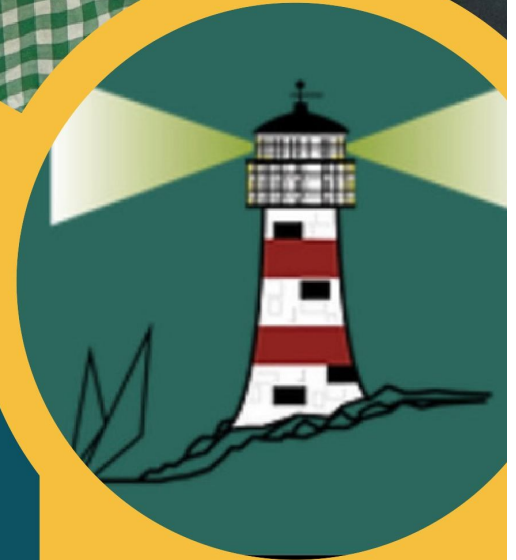
