

Message from Miss Gibbs

A fabulous full week back at Leverton. Our new children are settling in well and they all enjoyed their first launch day of the year!

Launch day: Classes always launch their new topics termly in an exciting way! You can see by the photos below the children enjoyed the day and are still excited to learn more about their topics.

Reminders for the beginning of the year :please ensure your child is not wearing jewellery at school, other than stud earrings (if they have their ears pierced) and a watch, but no smart watches. If your child wants their ears pierced, please wait until the next summer holidays. Children cannot wear earrings, even if their ears are covered for PE and will have to sit out for the whole lesson. Nail varnish or fake nails should not be worn for school, please remove these on a Sunday evening, also hair dye is not suitable for school and should not be worn.

Our staff car park is for staff only, blue badge holders may use the car park in the allocated times and will need to provide proof they are eligible. The car park is closed between: 8.30am—9.00am & 2.55pm-3.25pm and there will be no movement in the car park between those times.

Playground Behaviour: you may permit play-fighting at home with siblings, but it is not permitted in school. At school no one has the right to touch anybody else. We are firm regarding this, so please talk to your children regarding their actions in school.

Uniform is looking smart, a reminder that children can wear black shoes or black trainers.

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

Attendance: September 2024

The expectation for school attendance for pupils is 95% or above. As a school we want to improve on our whole school attendance which at the end of last year was 94%.

New guidance around attendance was made statutory on 19.8.24.

A new Attendance policy can be found on the school website.

The times of the start and close of the school day for pupils at Leverton Primary School are:

Gates open: 8.30am

School starts: 8.45am

Registration starts: 8.45am. Children arriving after 9.00am but before the registers close will receive a late mark 'L' and they will need to come in through the school office as the gates will be closed at 9am.

Registration closes: 9.15am

Any child arriving after 9.15am will receive a mark that shows them to be on site – 'U', but this will **not** count as a present mark and it will mean that they have an unauthorised absence; End of the school day: 3.15pm

The times of the start and close of the Nursery day for pupils are:

Gates open: 8.30am

Registration starts: 8.40am or 12.20pm. Children arriving after 9.00am or after 12.20pm but before the registers close will receive a late mark 'L' and they will need to come in through the school office as the gates will be closed at 9am and once the children have been collected at 12.20pm. Registration closes: 9.15am or 1.50pm

Any child arriving after 9.15am or 1.50pm will receive a mark that shows them to be on site – 'U', but this will **not** count as a present mark and it will mean that they have an unauthorised absence; End of the nursery day: 11.40am or 3.20pm

As a school, we are striving to vastly improve our attendance and we want to work together with you to ensure that children are in school every day and enjoy their learning, education and time at Leverton.

If you ever receive a letter about attendance, it is to make you aware of your child's attendance and we are always happy to discuss ways that we can support you, your child and family to help improve attendance.

Missing a few days of school here and there may not seem a big deal, but research shows that it can have a significant impact on children's learning and stop them from reaching their true academic potential.

Children who miss a substantial amount of school fall behind their peers, struggle to catch up and it can lead to big gaps in their learning.

Poor attendance often starts at primary school, and children who fall into this pattern are likely to underachieve at secondary school.

Friendships can be affected by absence, too: it can be hard for a child who misses lots of school to form relationships with their classmates.

If your child is ill, read the <u>NHS advice</u> to help you decide whether they can go to school. The link can be found in the school attendance policy on the school website.
