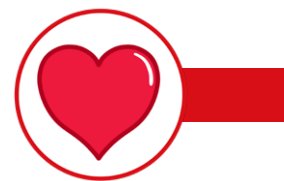


# Year 3 Feel It: Lesson 2

## Look Closely



### Background:

As children grow up they will move through different year groups and different after school groups. There will be many situations where they will come into contact with children of all ages. Most of these meet ups will be friendly positive experiences. However from time to time they may find themselves in moments of conflict or disagreement. These moments can be very upsetting and distressing but it's so important that they are never confused with bullying. We all have emotions, emotions that can let us down. If we hit out or shout at someone as a once off event it doesn't make us a bully. Bullying is intentional, repetitive behaviours that cause hurt or harm to another person. Bullying can be either physical or emotional. It's important that our children can distinguish if a situation is bullying or not bullying. They should always be encouraged to ask for help at any time if they are upset in any way but they should only use the words 'bullying' when it actually is 'bullying'.

If we react negatively to someone once it is not an example of bullying.</li><li>3. Behaviour that is intentional, repetitive and harms or hurts another is bullying.</li></ol>

### Glossary
