- Work with a friendly team.
- Have the opportunity to make a difference
 not just for your children, but for children in the years to come.
- Make a difference for other parents and influence the way the school works with them

- Remaining objective if your child is involved
- Confidentiality you may know things ahead of other parents and you must be able to keep those things to yourself
- Making difficult and potentially unpopular decisions
- Getting used to some of the jargon and terminology



GOVERNORS ARE:

- Able to get an understanding of how the school works; what it does well and the challenges it faces
- Able to influence the strategic direction of the school
- Able to look at year group results and performance data to hold the school leadership team to account
- Well-placed to understand parents' views
- Equal in Status to other governors

GOVERNORS ARE NOT:

- Expected to gather views of other parents
- To vote as instructed by other parents
- A link between parents and the governing body
- Able to get involved in the day to day running of the school
- Able to 'inspect' lessons
- Able to look at the results and performance of individual pupils
- Able to take individual responsibility for decisions or queries
